## Minnesota AFL-CIO Sample Caucus Resolution PAID FAMILY LEAVE

BE IT RESOLVED: That the	party support the Minnesota Paid Family
Leave Act, legislation that wou	ld provide up to six weeks of partial wage
replacement leave for birth or a	adoption of new child, parenting, or care of a
seriously ill family member.	

## **TALKING POINTS:**

- The Paid Family Leave Act will make it easier for parents—both mothers and fathers—to care for a newborn or newly adopted child.
- The Paid Family Leave Act will provide crucial support when a family member becomes seriously ill.
- The wage replacement in the propose Paid Family Leave legislation would range from 95% to 66% based on family income.
- Only about 14 percent of workers currently have access to paid parental leave.
- Research from other states suggest that businesses with Paid Family Leave have saved money, benefiting from lower worker turnover, increased productivity and higher employee morale
- Some of Minnesota's most recognized companies have recognized the benefits of providing Paid Family Leave policies. Some companies are General Mills, Ecolab, Mayo Clinic, Target, and U.S. Bank.
- Studies have shown that children whose parents used parental leave have higher educational attainment, lower teen pregnancy rates, higher IQ scores, and higher earnings in adulthood.
